# The necessity of bilingual education for children of multicultural families

In this environment, they are able to naturally develop a global mindset and competencies, and this will offer an opportunity for them to grow into global talents. In addition, it will help them adjust to school as they are recognized by friends and build self-esteem for being bilingual.

# Benefits of bilingualism

Bilingual ability dramatically affects the development of positive interactions between parents and children of multicultural families. Good communication also helps develop their relationships with their children. In particular, high intimacy between parents and children helps improve children's self-esteem.

# Bilingualism of children - why is it important?

- Children can establish a self-concept and be proud of their background.
- · Children can better adapt to their school and society.
- Children can build tolerance for other people and cultures.
- Promotes cognitive, social, and emotional development.
- Children will have less difficulty learning a new language.
- It increases their chances of getting a job, and they can think about various career paths.
